1.2.1 SOHS Advanced Simulation Building – Craig Sidjak, Director of Campus Development

Craig Sidjak gives the set reps an overview of the newly confirmed building proposal, Health Sciences Centre for Advanced Simulation. He goes over the square footage estimations (over 100,000 sq ft.), location (adjacent to SW1) and the feasibility process. This new building will support many components like specialty nursing, med-lab, cardiac sciences and more. It will be dedicated to learning spaces, and some classes will still take place in nearby buildings like SW3 and SW1.

Craig also explains elements of the concept design stage, such as sustainability, link to the current campus plan, campus life, e-learning, and more.
