What is a Set Rep?

Within their set, the Set Rep is the shepherd that brings their class together to form a community and build friendships. Outside the set, they are the voice of their peers and represent their classmates in the larger BCIT community.

A Set Rep is someone who wants to give back to their peers, so that student life at BCIT can be enhanced.

What does a Set Rep do?

1. Build Community

The primary role of the Set Rep is to connect with their classmates. They bring the set together to form a community and make lasting friendships.

2. Enhance Student Life Through Representation

As they connect with and form a trusting community within their set, the Set Rep learns the true needs of their classmates. They bring these needs to the attention of the Student Executives at meetings and represent the voice of their peers.

3. Attend Meetings

Each school holds two meetings per term. They are casual opportunities for socializing with the other Set Reps and for actioning the needs of their classmates. During a meeting, Set Reps will also be equipped with the tools to help them give back to their set and to build a community of their peers.

What does a Set Rep get?

1. Community Building Toolbox

Each Set Rep will be a better community builder and socializer after their time as a Set Rep. By being the leader of their set, they not only facilitate an enhancement of the classroom life, but they also become more capable leaders through experience. These valuable interpersonal skills can be taken wherever they may go in life, be it school, career, volunteering, or their own personal relationships.
