BACKGROUND:

In many organizations, the results of elections are not final until ratified by a governing body, such as Council. What this means is that Council agrees that the election was conducted fairly, and the results should stand. It does not mean that Council is expressing an opinion on whether or not the individuals named in the motion should become Executives – that was for members to decide during the election. Reasons why an election might not be ratified would be if the administration of elections had been improper or grossly inconsistent with the Bylaws. Partial ratification might occur where some but not all of the individual elections were competently administered, or where Council were aware of significant allegations of electoral impropriety against one of more candidates that might lead them to prefer to call for fresh elections.

In the case of the 2026 BCITSA Elections, there are no outstanding issues regarding any of the candidates and there are no pending appeals related to any of the results. Historically, the Election Committee has prepared a more detailed document for circulation, and work is nearly complete on this document. As there were no outstanding issues, and the document will primarily address broader trends and forward-looking recommendations, it is possible and advisable for Council to ratify the election process at this time. At a future date to be determined, a by-election will be held to fill the position of Chair of the School of Health Sciences, for which there were no candidates.

Executive Directors/Director of Finance/Organizational activities of note

- **Jill Dumanski**, Director of Engagement (maternity leave), has completed two weeks of training and job shadowing. Last week marked Shaleeta Harrison's final week before beginning her maternity leave, and we extend our warmest and best wishes to her during this time.
- We are pleased to announce the appointment of **Delaney Kamstra** as Clubs Program Coordinator. As she returns to this role, we are confident she will quickly re-establish the strong relationships she previously built and bring renewed energy and continuity to the program.
 - We note that, during the maternity leave period, there is a minor adjustment to the reporting structure, with Delaney reporting directly to the Co-Executive Directors.
- **Laura Barreca**, formerly Entrepreneurship Manager, assumes her new role as Director of Student Services effective today. We are delighted to congratulate her on this well-deserved appointment and are excited to work alongside her as she builds on the strong momentum and continued evolution of the Student Services Group
- Full day of Union Mediation on Friday April 10 – Progress made on several sections or articles

Engagement Group

Entrepreneurship & Leadership

- **Department Changes:** Laura is beginning to transition into the Director of Student Services position, while still managing the Entrepreneurship portfolio until this year's programs and events wrap up in late May. We will share more information about hiring for the Entrepreneurship/Leadership department when info is available.
- **Awards & Funding:** Applications for annual awards are open, and there are still two SIF intakes remaining this year (April 13 & May 18).
- **Student Work Experience Program:** The two SWEP students have had their first few shifts of tabling and things are going well so far. We will track engagement metrics and look for trends as they develop.

- **Trades Entrepreneurship event:** BCIT/SOCE has always partnered with the SA on the annual Trades Entrepreneurship panel event, but unfortunately, we have learned that they are unable to partner with us this year due to being short-staffed. We are working to come up with an alternative solution for this year only, and will most likely be offering in-class entrepreneurship content directly to students, coordinating with instructors, rather than our traditional panel event. Given the success of the panel event over previous years, the intention is to return to that format next year.
- **Tech Entrepreneurship Webinar:** We have ~100 people registered for the April 15th Tech Entrepreneurship webinar, run in partnership with the Alumni Association. One of the entrepreneurs on the panel is a former BCITSA President.

Wellbeing:

- The Wellbeing Team is down our Coordinator due to absence for the next 6-8 weeks at minimum. We are working with HR and our existing workforce to ensure that we continue to deliver our planned workplan on time, on budget and in consideration of student needs and staff wellbeing. At this time we have no concerns about our planned deliverables.
- **April 8th is Responding to Distress with Respect:** While a full slate of student leaders registered, we have had a few individuals select out. These spots are available to staff requiring training. Next steps include a mini evaluation and project report to suggest opportunities to explore next steps for increasing the ability for the SA to connect students in distress to clinical and peer supports as needed.
 - Quick Note: All went well. 15 participants with positive anecdotes received. Qualitative data coming soon.
- **May 22 and 29th we will pilot the Massage Clinics targeting trades students** in anticipation of a weekly launch this fall. All students are welcome and we are focusing on underserved populations demographically and by School.
- **Spring Planting** is underway with the Indigenous Gathering Place, Housing and Food Security Committee supporting students from equity deserving groups with connections to sustainability and food sovereignty. Student leaders interested in joining or playing the guitar (for the vibes) are encouraged to reach out to wellness@bcitsa.ca for more info on how to participate in the event happening outside housing **April 16th from 3-5 rain or shine** because we are not made of sugar.
- Planning is underway to **expand food pantry to Thursday afternoon from 3-5 in addition to Wednesday 1-3**. Exact date TBC pending personnel and technology confirmation. Target date is end April at the latest.
- Thanks to one of our wonderful volunteers, Lynn Stewart, we now have **soft plastic recycling in food pantry and thus far we have diverted at least two giant bags of soft plastic**. Hooray for sustainability and ingenuity.
- All other wellbeing programming is trucking along nicely according to our goals. We continue to enjoy working with many student volunteers, BCIT staff volunteers and SA staff to fill the gaps. We are truly overwhelmed by the positive support from everyone.
